

AWNING ERECTION

SCOPE

Contractor certified as having knowledge in the area of awning erection shall include and be limited to the fabrication, erection installation, maintenance, repair, alteration and extension of awnings and canopies which are attached to or supported by existing building or structure which are selfsupporting and may pour such footings and slabs on grade as may be necessary and incidental thereto and prefabricated sheds limited to two hundred (200) square feet, and may install such hardware as may be necessary and incidental to the extension and retraction of awnings and canopies. This category includes but is not limited to metal, canvas, and other storm shutters, as well as all business and finance knowledge/skills associated therewith.
